OPENING CEREMONY

City Recorder Tyrissa Howell conducted the opening ceremony.

ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

Lloyd Brinkerhoff moved, seconded by Rick Miller to adopt the agenda. The motion passed with all in favor.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Rick Miller moved, seconded by Alan Johnson to approve the minutes. The motion passed with all in favor.

UMCA ANNUAL CONFERENCE SEPT. 27-29, 2017-TYRISSA HOWELL

Trudi Owens moved, seconded by Lloyd Brinkerhoff to send Tyrissa Howell to the UMCA Annual Conference. The motion passed with all in favor.

UTAH LEAGUES OF CITIES AND TOWNS –SEPT. 13-15, 2017

BUSINESS LICENSE-BIG FISH FAMILY RESTAURANT/JIMMY OLDHAM

Alan Johnson moved, seconded by Rick Miller to approve the business license for Big Fish Family Restaurant. The Motion passed. Council Member Lloyd Brinkerhoff abstained from the vote.

LANDFILL CONTRACT

SWIMMING POOL CAPITAL PROJECTS FUND

SPLASH PAD/PICKLE BALL COURT

The City Council discussed options for a splash pad and pickle ball court. Council Member Alan Johnson is on the August 28 County Commission agenda to ask for additional funding.

Lloyd Brinkerhoff moved, seconded by Rick Miller to move forward with the Splash pad and pickle ball court plans. The motion passed with all in favor.

PANGUITCH CITY SPRINGS

The Mayor and City Manager have met with different water agencies and everyone has a different theory for the city springs. Mayor Eric Houston and City Manager Lori Talbot feel we should hire an engineer to create a plan to restore the city springs and then apply for funding.

Aerial seeding in the springs will be Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of this week.

The fence around the springs will be started on Monday August 28th.

Effects of the Brianhead Fire were discussed. Junes Sales and resort tax is down \$3000 from last year. Power at the Triple C is up \$2000 for June and \$2000 for July.

The Power for the City well is up \$1000 compared to last year.

Rick Miller moved, seconded by Alan Johnson to move forward with getting bids from engineering companies to create a plan to restore the city springs. The motion passed with all in favor.

PENDING BUSINESS

There are no changes to the pending business at this time.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Roads-The roads are being chip sealed, patching additional roads will continue in a couple of weeks.

Ice Fishing Derby-The Main Street Committee was thinking about canceling the Ice Fishing derby because of the conditions of Panguitch Lake, but it has been decided to continue with the derby.

Baseball-There have been some concerns brought up about how the concessions will be ran between the high school and the little league program. Also Kory would like to be the one to mow the lawns at the ball fields anytime it is needed.

Fire station-There have been some complaints that the bathrooms in the fire station are not being cleaned often enough.

Social Hall Weight room-The cables in the weight machines need to be replaced.

BILLS

The City Council reviewed the bills to be paid.

Trudi Owens moved, seconded by Lloyd Brinkerhoff to approve the bills. The motion passed with all in favor.
