OPENING CEREMONY

Council Member Alan Johnson conducted the opening ceremony.

ORDINANCE 2018-7

Major flooding at Indian Hollow and Delong Hollow caused water to leave their drainage paths causing the flooding to go over the spring collection boxes. One spring box was damaged in the flooding, causing the bottom two water tanks to fill with mud and debris. Saturday morning the water tanks were drained and the mud began to be shoveled out. Three sets of reverse 911 calls were sent out to the community informing them not to use the culinary water. All the information was posted on Panguitch.com and Facebook. Flyers were also passed out to the

community. Several people jumped into help by donating bottled water, finding a generator for the new well, shoveling out mud, printing and passing out flyers and offering their well water for use. Sunday the city's lines were flushed and at 2pm a boil order was put into place. Today water samples were sent to Cedar City to be tested. Two consecutive water samples, 24 hours apart have to come back clean to lift the boil order.

Darrin Robinson from Jones and Demille was at the meeting to discuss emergency funding options. Tyler Hoskins was also in attendance to discuss to progress of the new well and funding options.

Lloyd Brinkerhoff moved, seconded by Alan Johnson to approve ordinance 2018-7 declaring a state of emergency. The motion passed with all in favor.

Trudi Owens moved to adjourn 7:10 pm. The motion passed with all in favor.
