ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

Paul Dastrup moved, seconded by Alan Johnson to adopt the agenda. The motion passed with all in favor.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

Trudi Owens moved, seconded by Alan Johnson to approve the minutes. The motion passed with all in favor.

SUMMER EVENTS

Due to Covid19 the City Council discussed concerns for holding summer events in Panguitch City. Event Coordinator Steven Lee stated that protecting high risk individuals in the community, protecting businesses in the community and protecting the police force would be a high priority if events are held. Some council members were concerned about virus cases going up in the community if events are held; while other council members felt like the tourist are already visiting Panguitch.

2020-2021 APPROVED BUDGET
THE OWENS FAMILY ANNEXATION

Mike Sarles moved, seconded by Mark Boshell to enter a public hearing for the 2020-2021 approved budget and the Owen Family Annexation. The motion passed with all in favor.

There have been no changes to the budget since the last City Council meeting.

Council member Mark Boshell asked about water and sewer access to the lot being annexed.

Alan Johnson moved, seconded by Mike Sarles to exit the public hearing. The motion passed with all in favor.

2020-2021 APPROVED BUDGET

Paul Dastrup moved, seconded by Trudi Owens to approve the 2020-2021 approved budget. The motion passed with all in favor.

OWENS ANNEXATION

Mike Sarles moved, seconded by Alan Johnson to approve the Owens Family annexation. The motion passed with all in favor.

AJ JOHNSON PRELIMINARY SUBDIVISION

The subdivision is five acres divided into ten residential lots. The plan shows the roads will follow the size of the existing road measurements in the adjoining subdivision. Cul-de-sacs will have a 100 foot radius and water lines will tie into existing lines eliminating dead ends. The Planning and Zoning committee reviewed the plans and recommended approval of the preliminary subdivision.

Trudi Owens moved, seconded by Paul Dastrup to approve the AJ Johnson preliminary subdivision. The motion passed with all in favor. Alan Johnson abstained.

BUSINESS LICENSE – JCONN INDUSTRIES
